



Princess

Materials needed;

- white cardstock
- scissors
- a 2inch circle or scallop punch for the 2inch circles
(if you don't have a punch, you can cut out the circles
with your scissors)
- glue and tape
- lollipop sticks/cocktail sticks or special cupcake
topper sticks
- craft or x-acto knife
- cutting mat
- straight edge such as a metal ruler
- a tool (like a very dull knife or old ball point pen with
no ink inside or a special bone folder) you can score with

Scoring is the act of creating a line or depression in your paper that will help the paper fold easy. If you simply fold the paper your crease may look not so nice or the paper may even crack.

Now....

Print the PDF file on the cardstock.

Very important; when you print the PDF files, you find in the settings on the left side (just under how many copy's you want) the page scale. This has to say "none" otherwise you print everthing a little bit smaller.

Cut or punch out the 2 inch circles. If you use them as cupcake topper, simply tape cocktail stick (or the stick you are using) behind them. Or use 2 circles and glue the stick between them.

You can also use the circles to close your party invitation envelop, to decorate cups or as a tag, or make a little banner. Glue on a stripe of colored cardstock and use as a napkin ring or bottle wrapper.

For the place cards/food label cards;
Score dashed lines, cut cards and fold
